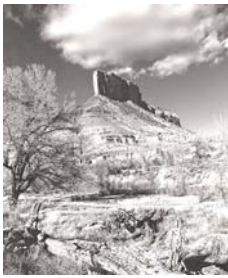

Rocky Mountain Arsenal National Wildlife Refuge

Some photo opportunities: Take advantage of the Refuge's *new* early morning hours. On each Sat and Sun you are able to enter at 6am, No reservation required. Good time to photograph the birds and other wildlife.

Visitors will now be able to come and enjoy the Refuge more often and stay longer! The Drop-in Program is expanded to include Tuesdays and Wednesdays in addition to Saturdays and Sundays. For birders, **photographers**, and early morning nature enthusiasts, the Refuge opens at 6:00 am and closes at 6:00 pm with Visitor Center hours from 7:30 am to 4:00 pm.

Wild Rides, the Refuge's two-hour wildlife public viewing tour, is offered on Wednesdays and Saturdays at 10:00 am by reservation. There are two different tour routes available at scheduled times for visitors to view and photograph wildlife, from burrowing owls to bison.
